

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, December 7, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey, Clark, and Sheldon present. A quorum was declared, and the meeting was officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Let the record show that Engineer Dan Davis, County Attorney Peter Johnson, IT Arnold Emberton, and Clint Blackburn were present for this meeting.

Engineer Dan Davis met with the board for the following:

Motion by Sheldon to allow Chairman Hickey to sign application for underground construction in ROW for Lumen for service to existing pedestals/terminals on Hwy 333, 0.5 miles east of Hamburg, IA. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Davis also discussed the need for new radios with the board. The sheriff's office is planning to get rid of the property at 701 Cass Street. Davis told the board that they have a repeater on the tower at the old sheriff's office. That will mean they must remove their repeater. He was quoted a price of \$3,200.00 per radio and would need 41 radios. Sheldon explained the situation regarding the lack of communication on the west side of the county. IT Emberton also informed the board that there was a fiber connection at that location that would have to be dealt with. They discussed options using a using the City of Sidney's water tower or using the DOT tower in Sidney. Sheldon's concern with that was that it would be at a lower elevation on the DOT tower. Davis said he would contact Mayor Ken Brown regarding the use of the water tower.

At 9:05 a.m., Sherrie Brink joined the meeting.

Motion was made by Clark to approve the following Resolution 2022-59. Motion carried unanimously.

Claims were approved for December 9, 2022.


In other business, the Recorder's Monthly Report for November and the Sheriff's Monthly Report for October were both approved.





The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, December 20, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey, Clark, and Sheldon present. A quorum was declared, and the meeting was officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Let the record show that Engineer Dan Davis, Safety Coordinator Jeff Shirley, Randy Moreland, Dawn Miller, and Liz Skillern with Valley News Today were present for this meeting.

At 9:07 a.m., Ellen Longman joined the meeting.

The board canvassed the Hamburg City Special Election. The following were elected:

Motion by Sheldon to declare the election results official. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Dan Davis met with the board for the following:

Engineer Davis updated the board that if they use the water tower for their radios Electronic Engineering told them that they would have to approval from Nebraska, Kansas, and Missouri. Davis will keep researching the project. Sheldon stated he will try to arrange a meeting with Kathy at Electronic Engineering after the first of the year.

Item (b) was approved last week and inadvertently placed on the agenda.

Motion by Clark to table any action on four underground construction permits on roadway crossings with Carbon Solutions. Motion carried unanimously.

Riley Moreland with Sidney Public Library, Dawn Miller with Tabor Library, and Ellen Longman with Hamburg Public Library met with the board regarding the library contracts. They requested that the board consider more funding for the libraries. This would include Farragut, Hamburg, Randolph, Sidney, and Tabor. They are requesting that it be raised to 6.75% for the current year as it has fallen short the several years at 6.58%. Dawn Miller highlighted services that the Lakin Center offers. The contract states taxed assessable rural property, so that is what the figures have been based on for years. Motion by Sheldon to increase library levy 8% from 6.75% for FY 2023/2024. Motion carried unanimously.

At 9:50 a.m., motion by Sheldon to go into recess until 10:00 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.

At 10:01 a.m., motion by Clark to go out of recess. Motion carried unanimously.

At 10:02 a.m., Jack Reed phoned in to discuss union negotiations. Motion by Clark to go into closed session pursuant to Iowa Code 20.17(3). Motion carried unanimously. Present for this meeting were Supervisors Hickey, Clark, and Sheldon, Auditor Dee Owen, Sheriff Kevin Aistrophe, and County Attorney Peter Johnson.


At 10:28 a.m., motion by Sheldon to go out of closed session. Motion carried unanimously.



The board discussed the decommissioning and road use agreements for the wind turbine project. Chairman Hickey explained that the decommissioning agreement states that the wind turbines must be taken down by Invenergy or any subsequent owner. The road use agreement covers the county so that they roads are returned to their original condition or better. Sherrie Brink asked if Page County is shut down if the project will go ahead. Dan Litchfield with Invenergy stated that he does not want to speculate if it will be shut down in that county. He stated that it was meant to be a two-county project. He stated they are working through issues in Page County. He explained that they will perform upgrades to the roads after they inspect at the beginning of the project if needed and the roads will be returned to the original condition or better. He stated this ensures that funding is available to decommission turbines when the project reaches the end of its' life. Roger Brink asked what the cost is to the county. Hickey and Lamppa both reiterated that there will be no cost to the county with this project. Sherrie Brink questioned how they will spray their crops if someone by them has a turbine. Hickey stated that they still spray crops in Missouri. Hickey called for a motion regarding the decommissioning and road use agreements. Motion by Clark to approve the decommissioning agreement and road use agreement as reviewed by the county attorney and engineer. The motion carried unanimously. These documents will be available for review at the Auditor's Office and the Recorder's Office.
