

A quorum was declared, and the meeting officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. Minutes of the previous board session were read and approved. The agenda was approved as posted.

Let the records show that Treasurer Alise Snyder, Deputy Recorder Pam Daniels, Liz Skillern with Valley News Today, and Ethan Hewett with KMA were present for this meeting.

Treasurer Alise Snyder met with the board for the approval of the semi-annual report. Motion by Sheldon to approve the semi-annual report. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Clark to Rescind Resolution No. 2021-58 regarding the Wellness Program. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Sheldon to set a public hearing date of February 2, 2022 at 9:30 a.m. for consideration of a UTV Ordinance for Fremont County. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed Fremont County becoming a 2nd Amendment Sanctuary County. Motion by Clark to approve Resolution No. 2022-5 Declaring Fremont County a Second Amendment Sanctuary County. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION 2022-5

A RESOLUTION DECLARING FREMONT COUNTY TO BE A SECOND AMENDMENT SANCTUARY COUNTY

WHEREAS, the right of the people to keep and bear arms is guaranteed as an individual right under the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution, and

WHEREAS, the right of the people to keep and bear arms for defense of life, liberty and property is regarded as an inalienable right of the people of Fremont County, Iowa, and

WHEREAS, the people of Fremont County, Iowa derive economic benefit from all safe forms of firearms recreation, hunting and shooting conducted within Fremont County using all types of firearms allowable under the United States Constitution and the laws of the State of Iowa, and

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Board of Supervisors were elected to represent the citizens of Fremont County, and have sworn by their Oath of Office to uphold the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Iowa, and

WHEREAS, legislation is currently being considered or expected to be proposed by both the Federal Legislature and the Iowa Legislature that potentially seeks to infringe on the constitutionally protected right of citizens to keep and bear arms, and

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Board of Supervisors wants to ensure that the rights of the citizens of Fremont County are protected, and

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Board of Supervisors understands that the Federal Legislature and the Iowa State Legislature cannot be solely trusted to protect citizens Second Amendment rights, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to declare that Fremont County is a Second Amendment Sanctuary County, as Fremont County opposes the enactment of any legislation or the issuance of executive order, that would infringe upon the constitutional right of the people of Fremont County to keep and bear arms.

NOW, THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED that the Fremont County Board of Supervisors hereby declares Fremont County to be a Second Amendment Sanctuary County, and hereby states its opposition to the enactment of legislation, the issuance of executive order, or the promulgation of any regulation after the date of adoption of this resolution that would infringe upon the constitutionally protected natural right of the people of Fremont County to keep and bear arms and shall apply to persons who have not had their right to bear firearms legally terminated.

This resolution shall not prohibit the enforcement of any federal and/or state laws in effect at the time its adoption (including Iowa Code Chapter 724) and shall not be construed to require any action or inaction that would violate Iowa Code Section 27B.2. Passed and adopted this 12th day of January, 2022.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-7

CONSTRUCTION EVALUATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Iowa Code section 459.304(3) sets out the procedure if a board of supervisors wishes to adopt a "construction evaluation resolution" relating to the construction of a confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2022 and January 31, 2023 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FREMONT COUNTY that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, January 26, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Clark and Sheldon present. Let the record show that Hickey was not present for this meeting. A quorum was declared, and the meeting officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. Minutes of the previous board session were read and approved. Motion by Sheldon to move action items up on the agenda to allow for time for the Invenergy presentation. Motion carried. The agenda was approved as amended.

Let the records show that Assistant County Attorney Ryan Dale, Engineer Dan Davis, Treasurer Alise Snyder, Maintenance Troy Housh, EMC Mike Crecelius, Sanitarian Erman Mullins, Mark Crowl, Isaac Lamppa, Brian Langner, Derry Wolford, Michael Koval, Ryan Urkoski, Kristi McEnaney, Ethan Hewitt with KMA, and Liz Skillern with Valley News Today were present for this meeting.

Engineer Dan Davis met with the board regarding the following:

Motion by Sheldon to allow Vice-Chairman Clark to sign IDOT payment voucher with HGM Associates for engineering services for J-10 and J-24 per agreement through December 31, 2021. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Sheldon to allow Vice-Chairman Clark to sign permit for SW Regional Water Expansion Project. Motion carried unanimously.

Troy Housh, Maintenance, met with the board requesting approval an agreement with Lawn World for fertilization. Motion by Sheldon to approve the Lawn World agreement. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Crowl and Isaac Lamppa with Invenergy met with the board to discuss and introduce their wind turbine project. There are 270 plus landowners that are signed up for the project across both counties. It is slated to bring in \$2 million per year in property taxes. It will generate construction jobs and add ten full-time positions in local area. Invenergy is ready to start submitting building permits in a month and approve construction and start operations by the end of 2023. Invenergy assured concerned citizens that their project meets or exceeds all aspects of the ordinance in place. They have done environmental studies. Assistant County Attorney Ryan Dale asked how they would be decommissioned. Invenergy stated that they would be entering into decommissioning agreements as soon as the permits are filed and the projects are set. Crowl told Dale that the turbines are almost all 100% recyclable. Brian Langner asked if the landowners who signed up are residents of the county or landowners that live elsewhere. Invenergy replied that it was a mixture of both. Sheldon voiced his concern for non-participating landowners. Langner urged the board to consult with other counties before signing permits. After much discussion on both sides of the issue the presentation concluded.


Claims were approved for January 28, 2022.
