

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, November 2, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey, Clark and Sheldon present. A quorum was declared, and the meeting officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Let the records show that Jared Moyer, John Moyer, Engineer Dan Davis, Jan Norris, Susie McDonald and Liz Skillern with Valley News Today were present for this meeting.

Jared and John Moyer met with the board to discuss the lack of advertisement for the county farm bid notice. Sheldon stated that it was published in the Hamburg Reporter and the Fremont-Mills Beacon back on Sept 30, 2022. John was concerned that it was only published once and everything else in the county that goes up for bid is published more than once. Sheldon and Clark both stated that they understand the frustration. John was worried that he has money invested into the property, they have cleaned up the terraces and removed the trees. John asked for the Board to change the deadline. Clark told him there is a process we must follow because it is public ground. Sheldon told John we cannot change the process and that they have been good tenants in years past. John requested to make the deadline invalid and to accept their bid today. Sheldon said we cannot do that. Jared presented the board with a bid to compare with the bids that were accepted by the deadline.

Motion by Sheldon to change the board meeting date from November 16 to November 15 to canvass the General Election as required by Iowa Code 50.24. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Dan Davis met with the board for the signing of the following:

Motion by Clark to allow Chairman Hickey to sign IDOT payment voucher with HGM Associates for engineering services for L-31 over Waubonsie Creek Bridge Management, per agreement through October 15, 2022. Motion carried unanimously.

The board opened bids for the county farm lease. The bids were due October 28th at 9:00 a.m. There was one bid received from B&C Farms LLC in the amount of \$255 per acre. Motion by Sheldon to table bid for proof of liability insurance.

Susie McDonald and Jan Norris met with the board to discuss an ordinance for pipelines in Fremont County.

In other business, the Recorder's Monthly Report for October was approved.


Claims were approved for November 4, 2022.

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, November 9, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey, Clark and Sheldon present. A quorum was declared, and the meeting officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Let the record show that Engineer Dan Davis, Curtis Green, Peter Johnson, and Liz Skillern with Valley News Today were present for this meeting.

Curtis Green met with the board to discuss an exemption for dust control application on M-16. The deadline for application is October 1st. He called the dust control company and they said they could get him the chemical and he could spray it himself. Engineer Dan Davis said that they would grant him the exemption and asked that he put flags up on each end. They will avoid grading it. Green asked if he couldn't afford the material if he could still put up the flags and keep them from grading it. Davis said he could. Supervisor Sheldon stated that they will grade it if it becomes a traffic hazard. Davis said he would have his crew take lathe out to mark it. The board also asked him not to put fence posts to mark it as it will create a hazard.

At 9:14 a.m., Sheriff Kevin Aistrope joined the meeting.

The board discussed the county farm lease. The bidder submitted proof of insurance as requested by the board last week. Motion by Clark to accept the lone bid for the county farm. Motion carried unanimously.

Sheriff Kevin Aistrope asked who the county attorney is presently. The board stated it was Ryan Dale right now due to the 28E Agreement and Naeda Elliott's resignation. Aistrope was concerned with a public records request that needs to be fulfilled timely. The board called Dale at 9:16 a.m. He stated he would work with the sheriff later this afternoon to get this resolved.

At 9:20 a.m., Chief Deputy Bothwell joined the meeting.

Supervisor Sheldon discussed the tower needed for improved communications. He spoke about having zero radio capabilities in a certain area. Sheldon's concern was that the bid for this tower was almost as much as the total cost of the original radio project. They discussed using a monopole instead of a tower. They also discussed other tower options. Sheldon would like to have a meeting with Motorola with some of the decision-makers present. The board and sheriff's office will try to set up a meeting.


Aistrope also discussed the old jail building. The City of Sidney would like the building. The porch is falling off. The generator can't be certified. He would like the board to be thinking about the options for that building. After much discussion, the sheriff stated he would get on the agenda and they would discuss it and possibly set a date for a possible sale.

Claims were approved for November 11, 2022.

At 9:47 a.m., there being no further business, Sheldon made a motion to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.





The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, November 23, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey and Clark present. Let the records show that Sheldon was absent from this meeting. A quorum was declared, and the meeting was officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

Let the record show that Assistant Engineer Robbie Kromminga, Roger McQueen, A.J. Lyman, Nicolette McCullough, William Reeves, and Peter Johnson were present for this meeting.

Shenandoah Mayor Roger McQueen & City Manager A.J. Lyman met with the board to discuss a Joint City/County Agreement for Amendment #4 to the Amended & Restated Shenandoah Urban Renewal Area. This is regarding the voluntary annexation of unincorporated areas in Fremont County. Motion by Clark to sign the agreement. Motion carried unanimously. The agreement is available for viewing in the Fremont County Auditor's Office.

Assistant Engineer Robbie Kromminga met with the board for the following:

Motion by Clark to allow Chairman Hickey to sign work in ROW permit for Shannon Smith to clean ditch from 102nd Street north to Mills County line on east side of 210th Avenue. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Clark to allow Chairman Hickey to sign IDOT payment voucher with HGM Associates for engineering services for emergency repair construction services on J-64 per agreement through July 31, 2022. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Clark to allow Chairman Hickey to sign IDOT payment voucher with HGM Associates for engineering services for emergency repair services on J-64 per agreement through October 31, 2022. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Clark to allow Chairman Hickey to sign work in ROW permit for Tim Dreyer to place waterline through 380th Avenue between Sections 19 and 20 in Fisher Township. Motion carried unanimously.

Nicolette McCullough and William Reeves of Thurman met with the board to discuss the sidewalks in the City of Thurman. She has emails with Dan Davis going back to 2017. She stated that people are not able to walk on the sidewalks when there is rain or ice as it pools in certain areas. McCullough said that the bus drops all kids at this spot, water pools so kids must go into the street. She later was told that it was closed out and HGM was not willing to do anything. McCullough believes that HGM was hired for a job and should have completed it. She said they shot grade incorrectly in several spots. People in town tried to tell them and they didn't listen. She has email communication from November 8th, 2018, stating the county was waiting on contract with HGM and HGM thinks they can improve on it. Assistant Engineer Robbie Kromminga said drainage issues are extensive in Thurman. Supervisor Clark asked if it could be tiled. Kromminga said that normally they are not doing sidewalks. He thought maybe they could dig out the ditch to at least get it off the sidewalk. Clark also mentioned a sediment basin might not be a permanent fix, but it is better than nothing. Kromminga said he will discuss it with Engineer Davis next week. He will reach out to McCullough to keep her updated.

Auditor Dee Owen met with the board to discuss raising the pay for election workers. The rate of pay has been \$8.00 since 2005. She would like to raise the rate to \$10.00. She has the funds in her budget. She emphasized the long hours they put in and the importance of their work. Motion by Clark to change the hourly rate of pay for election workers from \$8.00 to \$10.00. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed a resolution to change the county attorney position from full-time to part-time now that the 28E with Mills County is broken. Motion by Clark to approve Resolution No. 2022-58. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-58

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING COUNTY ATTORNEY AS A PART-TIME POSITION

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Attorney is currently designated as a "full-time" position for the purposes of Section 331.752 of the Iowa Code; and

WHEREAS, Fremont County Attorney-elect Peter Johnson and the Fremont County Board of Supervisors agree that this resolution take immediate effect pursuant to Section 331.752(3) and 331.752(4); and

WHEREAS, Fremont County Board of Supervisors believes that it would be more beneficial to the citizens of the County and that it is in the County's best interest to designate the County Attorney position as a "part-time" position for the purposes of Section 331.752.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Fremont County Board of Supervisors that, effective November 23, 2022, the County Attorney position shall be designated a "part-time" position for the purposes of Section 331.752. The annual salary for said "part-time" position shall be seventy-two thousand one hundred ten dollars (\$72,110.00) or as otherwise amended from time to time by the Fremont County Compensation Board and the Fremont County Board of Supervisors.

Let the record show that County Attorney Peter Johnson, Tyler Laughlin, and Liz Skillern with Valley News Today were present for this meeting.


