

At 8:30 a.m., a department head meeting was held. Those present were Randy Hickey, Chris Clark, Dustin Sheldon, Kevin Aistrope, Alise Snyder, Vicki Kirkpatrick, Arnold Emberton, Tarah Berry, Troy Housh, Dee Owen, and Jeff Shirley. County safety and workman's compensation was discussed.

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, October 5, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey, Clark, and Sheldon present. A quorum was declared, and the meeting officially called to order at 9:01 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Let the records show that Assistant Engineer Kevin Lewis, Maintenance Troy Housh, Conrad Hall, Matt Woods, Jim Olmstead, Peter Johnson, and Liz Skillern with Valley News Today were present for this meeting.

Engineer Jim Olmstead stated they addressed concerns from the meeting on September 14th. He stated that they are a little tight on that north side where it meets I-29 with the changes. They also took care of concerns on the south side. Olmstead stated that he spoke to John Askew with Missouri Valley Drainage District as the board requested. Askew said that he had no concerns with the project. Olmstead also addressed Vice Chairman Clark's concerns with the off ramp onto I-29. The IDOT said they would look at that and thanked Clark for bringing it to their attention. Sheldon worried in an event like 2019 it may cause the closure of I-29 on the north edge of the proposed district. Motion by Clark to approve Resolution No. 2022-57. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-57

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING HIGHWAY 2/I-29 CROSSROADS LEVEE DISTRICT

THIS RESOLUTION is adopted by the Fremont County Board of Supervisors establishing a levee district named Highway 2/I-29 Crossroads Levee District, as follows:

WHEREAS, affected landowners previously filed a Drainage/Levee Petition ("Petition") with the Fremont County Auditor in or around October 22, 2020, for the establishment of a levee system to be located at the Highway 2 and I-29 interchange located in Fremont County, Iowa; and

WHEREAS, in accord with Chapter 468 of the Iowa Code, Olmsted & Perry Consulting Engineers, Inc. ("Olmsted") was duly appointed to provide a plan and report for the establishment of such a levee district to protect property owners generally located at the intersection of Highway 2 and Interstate 29 in Fremont County, Iowa; and

WHEREAS, Olmsted has prepared and presented to the Fremont County Board of Supervisors an Engineering Report in accord with §468.14 of the Iowa Code dated August 31, 2021, and as revised February 21, 2022, for consideration by the Fremont County Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, Olmsted presented the Engineering Plan to the Fremont County Board of Supervisors on March 23, 2022, and the Fremont County Board of Supervisors desires to tentatively approve said Engineering Report dated August 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, a Resolution Approving Plan and Report of Engineer for Proposed Highway 2/I-29 Crossroads Levee District was adopted by the Fremont County Board of Supervisors on July 17, 2022 and, pursuant to §468.14 of the Iowa Code, a Public Hearing was established for the date of August 17, 2022, at 9:30 a.m. at the Fremont County Courthouse; and

WHEREAS, on file with the Fremont County Auditor's Office is the Affidavit of Service of Notice of Hearing of all effected landowners in conformity with §468.14 of the Iowa Code, and on file with the Fremont County Auditor's Office is Proof of Publication of Notice of the proposed levee district and public hearing in conformity with §468.15 of the Iowa Code; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the establishment of the proposed district in accord with §468.15 of the Iowa Code occurred on August 17, 2022, and final vote to establish the proposed levee district was scheduled for September 15, 2022, and postponed to October 5, 2022, subject to Plan and Report amendments by Olmsted, which said amendments were filed with the Fremont County Auditor on or about September 1, 2022, and September 28, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Fremont County Board of Supervisors having been informed that no written objections have been filed with the Fremont County Auditor prior to or at the time of the public hearing, having heard comments and proposals concerning the establishment of proposed Highway 2/I-29 Crossroads Levee District as revised, finds that this Resolution should be adopted establishing Highway 2/I-29 Crossroads Levee District in conformity with Chapter 468 of the Iowa Code.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE FREMONT COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Petition filed with the Fremont County Auditor in or around October 22, 2020, for the establishment of a levee system to be located at Highway 2 and the I-29 interchange in Fremont County, Iowa and the Engineering Plan as revised on February 21, 2022, and subsequently amended on or about September 1, 2022, comply with the requirements of law in both form and substance, and that such improvement would be conducive to the public health, convenience, welfare, benefit of utility, and that the cost thereof is not excessive, that the construction of the levee will materially benefit the effected lands, and there are no claims filed for damages. In conformity with §468.22 of the Iowa Code, the Fremont County Board of Supervisors hereby locates and hereby establishes said Highway 2/I-29 Crossroads Levee District in accordance with the recommendations of the Engineering Report and Plans on file by Olmsted & Perry Consulting Engineers as revised and dated February 21, 2022, and as subsequently amended on or about September 1, 2022, and on or about September 28, 2022.
2. In conformity with §§468.22 and 468.24 of the Iowa Code, the Fremont County Auditor shall appoint three appraisers to assess the value of the right of ways, if any, required for the Levee District's improvements. Said appraisers shall consist of one

licensed engineer in the State of Iowa and two fee holders of Fremont County who have no legal interest in the proposed improvements concerning the established Highway 2/I-29 Crossroads Levee District. Said appraisers shall take and subscribe an oath to examine said lands, ascertain and impartially assess all damages according to their best judgment, skill, and ability all in accord with §468.24 of the Iowa Code.

The board discussed the county attorney position. The board will leave the 28E in place with Mills County and they will be represented by whomever is appointed in Mills County.




Claims were approved for October 7, 2022.

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, October 12, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey, Clark, and Sheldon present. A quorum was declared, and the meeting officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Let the records show that Assistant Engineer Robbie Kromminga, Derek Montgomery, Riley Gibson, Susie McDonald, Tom McDonald, and Liz Skillern with Valley News Today were present for this meeting.

Susie McDonald spoke regarding the pipeline project. She stated that this will be this company's first project. Farm Bureau stated they cannot cover landowners if a breach occurs and said they would have to assess it if it ever happens. She believes there needs to be an ordinance in place to protect landowners. Landowners do not want this project. She presented a map showing the closeness to the area of Hy Vee. She said that Summit wasn't planning to add an odorizer to the pipeline which would leave people unaware if there was a leak until it was too late. She cited affects on people at a breach in another state. She cited the differences between carbon and gas and oil pipelines.

At 9:08 a.m., Assistant County Attorney Ryan Dale joined the meeting.

Derek Montgomery and Riley Gibson with Summit Carbon Solutions met with the board to give a project update. Riley Gibson stated that they work with Turnkey Logistics and represent Summit Carbon Solutions. He discussed the route of the pipeline starting at the ethanol plant. He said they have crossed the 50% mark of voluntary easements for the State of Iowa. He said the project is regulated by the state and federally. They would also go through county roads for permitting. Gibson emphasized they are going above the standards required. He stated the minimum dept of cover is 3 feet. He said in most cases they would be going 4 feet deep. He said in other areas like the Nishnabotna River they would be well below that. They X-ray 100% of welds when only 10% is required. The project is CFR 195 regulated. They have a full-time staff in Ames that would watch pressures 24 hours per day. He said there would be 4 miles of line before they get into Page County. Assistant County Attorney Dale asked what percentage of land acquisition there is in Fremont County. They said it was 18%, but they are currently in negotiations. Dale asked if the application with utilities board is still pending. Gibson stated it is pending until summer of next year. Dale asked if utility board approves permit if it gives them a right to invoke eminent domain. Montgomery stated yes. Tom McDonald asked why the depth is 4' when the frost line here is 56 inches. They said they would work with landowner to go deeper if requested. They discussed the size of the pipeline, pressures, and pump stations. Montgomery stated that more states are looking at restrictions on ethanol and the pipelines are designed to protect and defend ethanol. They discussed the what if's of leaks with the McDonald's. After much discussion, Gibson said they plan to update the board regularly on progress.

Assistant Engineer Robbie Kromminga met with the board for the signing of the following:
Motion by Clark to allow Chairman Hickey to sign application for approval of underground construction in ROW with Windstream Iowa Communications, LLC for buried copper cable across and along Bluff Road to 1166 Bluff Road. Motion carried unanimously.

Auditor Dee Owen discussed with the board the handling hazard mitigation grant funds. She spoke with EMC Crecelius and would like to see this grant run through the emergency management fund instead of the General Fund as was done in 2016. She asked the board if they could pay the publication costs associated with the grant. Motion by Sheldon to pay the publication costs for the grant. Motion carried unanimously.

Claims were approved for October 14, 2022.

At 9:25 a.m., there being no further business, Clark made a motion to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
