The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, September 14, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey, Clark, and Sheldon present. A quorum was declared, and the meeting officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Let the records show that Engineer Dan Davis, Liz Skillern with Valley News Today, Matt Sells, Kaley Neal, Kurt Henstorf, Ty Davison, Matt Woods, and Jim Olmstead were present for this meeting.

The board discussed the EMS as essential services issue. Supervisor Sheldon spoke about a meeting in Hamburg regarding the subject. He said Shenandoah has taken the lead on the project and action that will be forthcoming. He spoke about the need to send notices to those affected such as municipalities and the forming of a board to discuss the process. He spoke about the tax cycle, public meetings to be held, and other items.etc. He discussed the challenges they are facing in the rural communities. Vice-Chairman Clark asked what the tax money could be spent on. Sheldon stated trainings, buildings, equipment, pretty much everything except salaries. Sheldon said they would like to have the funds allocated on a per call/need basis. The money will go to the taxing bodies to disperse. Chairman Hickey would like to see the board that is formed hold the public meetings, so they can explain the need. Clark said a good place to start might be to speak at the local events such as pancake feeds. Sheldon said they would like to start organizing around December. Matt Sells said they would like the agencies to take the lead as much as possible. He said they would support a special election. Kurt Henstorf said they could get started on the notification to the governing bodies so they have a format to present when they do hold meetings. Sheldon stated that he was worried that a special election might be the wrong time to do it because they typically have a low turnout. He doesn't want to rush the process. Sells said there are 13 counties with this on the November ballot and it will be interesting to see how that goes. Sheldon agreed and said we can use those counties to find out what worked and what didn't. He said they can discuss with Mills County how their process went.

The board discussed changes made at the landowners' requests regarding the proposed Highway 2/1-29 levee district. The engineer met with landowners to address their concerns and made changes accordingly. The board received an objection letter after the deadline from Maureen Collins. She asked for clarification on how protecting the businesses became more of a priority rather than keeping traffic moving. She is unable to get ahold of the DOT or attend their next meeting. Supervisor Sheldon also shared that Kevin Kruse and Denny Holliman do not want to participate any more. They both contacted him Monday. Kruse does not want it on his property at all. Holliman said that they levee would be detrimental to the drainage on his fields and he would also lose his field drive. Sheldon said he would also like to see something in writing from Missouri Valley Drainage District to see if they would be moving the water if it was necessary. Woods and Olmstead both stated they thought they could still work around these issues. Woods said one of them would talk to MVDD to see if they could arrange a document of consent and support for this district. Sheldon said he also spoke to Leroy Bowman about the others' feelings. Woods said that they would talk to Bowman as well. Motion by Sheldon to table the resolution to the October 5<sup>th</sup> meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Clark to change meeting date for next week from September 21 to September 20 to allow for the canvass Hamburg School Special Election. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed appointing a weed commissioner due to the death of the former one. Supervisor Clark said Randy Moyer is interested in serving as weed commissioner. Motion by Sheldon to appoint Randy Moyer as weed commissioner. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Dan Davis met with the board for the following:



The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, September 20, 2022, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Hickey, Clark, and Sheldon present. A quorum was declared, and the meeting officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Let the records show that Assistant Engineer Robbie Kromminga, Purchasing Agent Jeff Shirley, and Liz Skillern with Valley News Today were present for this meeting.

At 9:00 a.m., Assistant Engineer Robbie Kromminga opened bids for Project #CO36(2023 Pavement Markings)- -73-36. There was one bid received from Iowa Plains Signing. The bid was for \$299,852.20. Kromminga said that he will take it back to review it and compare it to their estimates. He would bring it back before the board after the review.

At 9:05 a.m., the canvass was held for the Hamburg School Special Election. Assistant Auditor Erin Achenbach presented the canvass materials to the board. The election was held for the issuance of General Obligation Bonds in the amount of \$3.1 million. The measure passed with 140 yes votes and 92 no votes. He thinks there should be a representative from each township, city, fire/rescue, Shenandoah EMS, Grape Community Hospital, emergency management, and the board of the supervisors. Motion by Sheldon to establish advisory board with members from each municipality, rescue squad each township, Grape Community Hospital, Shenandoah Medical Center, Shenandoah EMS, and the City of Shenandoah. Troy Housh, Maintenance, met with the board requesting approval of the Lawn World irrigation winterization contract renewal. Motion by Sheldon to approve the Lawn World contract. Motion carried unanimously.

Tandon Van Scyoc stopped in to visit with the board regarding the status of the moratorium on wind turbines. The board stated that they have not worked on this to date. The assistant county attorney has been working on other projects. Van Scyoc discussed the endangered species that are involved and questioned the board's concerns about that. The board explained that the issue is between the landowner and wind turbine company. They also explained that any environmental concerns would be between the turbine company and the federal government. That is above the board's scope of practice.

Claims were approved for September 30, 2022.

At 9:17 a.m., there being no further business, Sheldon made a motion to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
